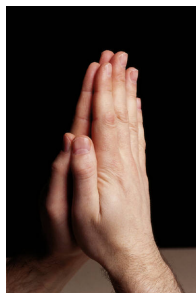

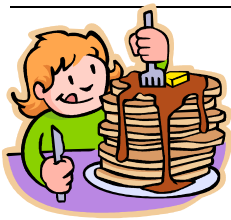

Questions of the week for the solemnity of Mary, Holy Mother of God

DNA Extraction Lab

Mrs. Marshall's seventh grade class performed a DNA Extraction Lab. We used green peas for this experiment because DNA is the blueprint for life. Everything living contains DNA.

For Step one: Mrs. Marshall put $\frac{1}{2}$ cup split peas, $\frac{1}{8}$ tsp. table salt, and 1 cup cold water into a blender. She blended these items on high for 15 seconds. The blender separated the pea cells, so you had a pea soup.

Step two: Mrs. Marshall poured the soap into a strainer and then poured it into another container. She added two tablespoons of liquid detergent, and then swirled it to a mix. She let the mixture sit for 5-10 minutes. She then poured the mixture into test tubes and gave it to us to start out experiment.

Step three: We then added an enzyme to the mixture and stirred carefully. We used a meat tenderizer for the enzyme.

Step four: We then tilted our test tube and put rubbing alcohol into the test tube. The alcohol floated to the top of the test tube. White foamy stuff formed where the alcohol and pea soup met. The white "stuff" was DNA!

Results: DNA is a white stringy molecule. It became undissolved when the DNA came into contact with the rubbing alcohol.

The use of the experiment let the students have a hands-on demonstration on DNA forms and mixes to create things. We were able to see the formation first-hand and the development before our eyes.

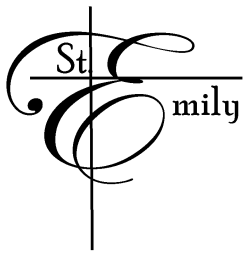
