## Peter and Melissa Hajdu

On September 25th, the Most Rev. Joseph N. Perry, Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Chicago, will call Peter Hajdu to the Rite of Admission to Candidacy for Holy Orders (Order of Deacon) at the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception, University of St. Mary of the Lake/Mundelein Seminary in Mundelein. He is one of 13 men to be formally admitted as deacon candidates in the English-speaking formation program.

In the Rite, Peter rises and publicly and freely answers two questions from Bishop Perry: "In response to the Lord's call are you resolved to complete your preparation so that in due time you will be ready to be ordained for the ministry of the Church?" and "Are you resolved to prepare yourself in mind and spirit to give faithful service to Christ the Lord and His body, the Church?"

In this way, Peter is admitted into the rank of candidates for the diaconate. Candidacy is the first official recognition by the Church of the positive signs of his vocation to the diaconate, which must be confirmed in the next three years of formation—a period that includes academic courses, spiritual formation and direction, pastoral ministry experiences, human/personal development, field education, internships, and more.

To get to this point in his formation, Peter has journeyed through a one-year period of discernment called the Aspirancy Path that included prayer and spiritual formation sessions, classes on the Catechism, days of reflection on the deacon's share in the bishop's ministries, field ministry experiences in ministering to a culturally diverse Church, a field education experience in Service to Charity, monthly spiritual direction, and a retreat during which he prayed and reflected with his family over his possible call to the ordained ministry of deacon.

Peter's wife, Melissa, also was required to participate in this year of Aspirancy. Her goals were to learn more about the diaconate, and to discern whether she can continue to support her husband through the coming years of formation and possibly as an ordained deacon. Wives are required to write a letter of consent to Cardinal George that notes their free, informed consent to their husbands' moving to the candidacy path.

Please keep Peter and Melissa Hajdu, their family and all those in formation in your prayers that they might continue to answer God's call in their lives.

## FAMILIAR INSIGHTS

Spiritual teachers tend to repeat themselves, and to repeat other teachers. Maybe there really aren't that many different truths to tell. Just a lot of slow, sleepy human beings—like us—who need to hear the basics over and over. Consider today's readings.

In Jesus' story of the farmer and his sons, everyone knows that the one who said he wouldn't work—but did—is way ahead of the one who said he would work—but didn't. "Talk is cheap." Heard that before?

## PREPARING FOR THE NEW TRANSLATION OF THE MASS

### Why a New Translation?

On the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011, Catholic parishes in the United States will begin praying the texts of the Mass using a new English translation of the Roman Missal. Many have wondered why the Church is implementing a new translation of the prayers of the Mass at this time. When you really think about it, it makes all the sense in the world that the Church is implementing a new translation that is more faithful to the original Latin because the Mass is the very core of Catholic life. The prayers of the Mass express our Catholic beliefs and the more clearly we can express those beliefs, the more our faith can grow and be nourished. Many Church leaders, most prominently the late Blessed Pope John Paul II, felt that many of the current translations of the Latin were done hastily after the Second Vatican Council in the early 1960s, when the Church throughout the world began praying the Mass in the languages of the people rather than in Latin. The new translation that we will be using has taken nearly a decade to produce and, as Pope John Paul II desired, is closer to the original Latin.

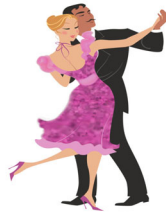

Transitional deacons are in the process of moving toward priesthood. *Permanent deacons* (who may be married and have families) are on a distinct path to remaining as a deacon - permanently. Their role and function is different from priests. Deacons assist at liturgies, proclaim the gospel, preach, evangelize in the workplace and help the poor and needy in direct ways.
